Dear Delany Community,

My son and I saw the film **Dunkirk** last weekend, after reading very positive reviews, which we found moving and inspirational. What was memorable were the numerous vignettes depicting individuals, both military personnel and civilians, acting selflessly and compassionately under the most horrific circumstances. Their actions, in all the cases, involved saving other lives while placing their own lives in mortal danger. One particular scene, without telling too much of the plot, had a fighter pilot make the tough decision of either flying back home with the fuel available or return to the battle to intercept an enemy bomber intent on destroying a ship loaded with British troops. He returned and shot the enemy bunker out of the sky but was later captured when he had to crash land his plane after it ran out of fuel.

The films popularity stems from not only its cinematography and real-like action scenes, but I believe its positioning of values such as camaraderie, tenacity, fearlessness and kindness that appeals to all generations. Underpinning its main plot are subtle reminders of a society imbued with qualities that respect the other and had closely to hope, gratitude, love, optimism, a positive identity and good relationships.

We and you the parents have an obligation to teach these values and more importantly, as adults, to live and be true role models for our young people.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the work of Ms Louise Broue and her team in organising the Monsignor McGovern Art Night. The annual event recognises and celebrates the many artistic talents in our local Catholic Primary schools. Congratulations to our winners and we hope to one day read about their future artistic accomplishments.

FROM THE PEDAGOGICAL LEADERS

STEM – is a word that has been around a lot lately. But what does it mean? STEM is an acronym that stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (and sometimes you might see STEAM with A for Art) but it is much more than an acronym – it is potentially our students passport for the future.

Research has shown that students who study STEM are more creative, flexible and able to take advantage of the changes that are predicted in the workforce and workplaces of the future. Jobs from accounting, construction, nursing, to hairdressing all use STEM skills – let alone what the jobs of the future might be.

As digital technology disrupts more and more industries, there's a real concern that there won't be enough STEM-qualified people to work in the jobs of the future. But how do we get more people interested in and taking up STEM subjects at school?

At Delany our focus on STEM is about providing a curriculum based on the idea of educating our students in four specific disciplines — science, technology, engineering and mathematics — in an interdisciplinary and applied approach. We understand that STEM is important because it pervades every part of our lives. Science is everywhere in the world around us. Technology is continuously expanding into every aspect of our lives.



STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) are the foundations of the industrial and corporate world. While these are some of the most important subjects, students often overlook them, it is a skill-set that is in high demand by employers.
