Dear Delany Community,

I welcome our new Year 7 cohort, their parents and all new families with children in other year groups. We are so pleased that you have chosen Delany College as the school for your child. I also welcome our new staff for 2019;

- Stephanie Rodrigues (Mathematics)
- Dominic Charter (HSIE/RE)
- Lucas Matto (Science)
- Lillian Treanor (English)

Other staff changes include Mr Robinson being seconded to work at the CEDP office with Ms Cook taking on the curriculum leader position. She will answer any questions you have regarding subject choices, timetabling and supporting students with their learning.

We have taken the time in the first week of school to deliver the school goals for 2019. Students have been asked how they can achieve the Literacy, Numeracy and Formation goals set by the College. In Literacy, our aim is to improve reading and writing at or beyond a student's grade level. This requires not only teacher assistance but students practicing the reading and writing strategies at home. We made some significant gains last year, as indicated in NAPLAN and PAT-R, and we are planning to achieve better results this year.

Our Mathematics teachers are working with all students in developing skills in problem solving. This includes strategies defining the problem, taking steps to use different approaches to find a solution and then justify their relation. For many of our students, worded maths problems are more difficult and our aim is to support their thinking in achieving a regular success rate.

Our Formation goal is very much linked to the Gospel of Luke, which is the gospel of the year. We will examine Luke and how his message can be enacted in our lives everyday.

Further to this our teachers will be focusing on two priorities for 2019; Design Thinking and Know my impact on student learning. Design Thinking has been around for some time and at Delany, we are working with a consultant who has already trained our leaders last year with the view that staff will be trained on Monday, 18 February - our first staff professional learning day (pupil-free day). The elements of Design Thinking provide a structured approach to thinking through a problem and finding the best solution. It reinforces the idea that the person is at the centre of the solution process and the outcomes should always have a positive impact.

We will plan for students to undergo the training later in the year to support them in making correct choices while they engage with the learning process.

Secondly, teachers have been asked to constantly reflect on their impact in the learning process. The school's professional learning program will endeavour to provide the time and processes to enable this to happen. This will be an ongoing enquiry process that will ensure the best learning opportunities for our students.

Sadly, Brother Joseph Byrne, who after several weeks of very poor health, passed away on the morning of 1 February 2019. He served the Granville, Fairfield and Blacktown communities during his sixty-two years in the ministry of the Patrician Brothers. Grant eternal rest unto him O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace.



Brother Joseph Byrne was born to James and Annie on the 9 May, 1939. He hails from County Wicklow in Ireland. He came to Australia on the P&O Liner *Himalaya*, arriving in Sydney in December 1957. For many years he was known by his religious name as Basil before reverting to his baptismal name of Joseph.

For the greater part of his first thirty years in Australia Joseph served in the boys' primary schools of Granville, Blacktown and Fairfield, fulfilling multiple roles, but mainly as teacher and principal. His terms as primary principal: Blacktown, 1968 and 1969; Granville, 1975 to 1980; and Fairfield, 1981 and 1982. His longest posting was at Granville (1958 – 1967 & 1970 – 1980). In 1984 he took a year's study leave after which he made a transition into parish work as a pastoral associate.

His initial pastoral work was in the parish of Blacktown and from 1997 he was an active member of the parish pastoral team in the parish of St John's Riverstone.

As well as being advanced in the spiritual domain, Joseph had a great commitment to physical fitness also. He was a regular and good golfer, squash player, and a keen cyclist, even cycling to Melbourne on one occasion!

Poor health required Joseph moving into Rosary Village Aged Care, Yennora, in June 2018. He was comfortable and happy there until his health seriously deteriorated in early January 2019. He died in his sleep on the morning of the 1st February. He had ministered as a Patrician for sixty-two years.

I encourage you to ask your child what they learned during the day, what was the best or funniest experience, who's in their friendship group, and how you can support them in their learning.

On Wednesday 13 February the College celebrated our opening Mass for 2019. We joined with Holy Trinity Primary to ask the Holy Spirit to stay close throughout the year. I think it's a very positive experience for our students to be immersed with the primary students! These young students bring an energy that is irresistable and a hum that makes you smile. RELIGIOUS EDUCATION COORDINA- World Youth Day 2019 Reflection TOR

Welcome back to all our families from 2018 and a big welcome to our new families to the school. 2019 has already been a success with our students diving into a range of formation opportunities from the onset.

On the first day back of school, Year 7-10 students participated in a formation workshop. This allowed them to consider the formation goal for this year:

Students and staff apply the concepts of community, dignity and reconciliation, embedded within the Gospel of Luke, to all of their relationships, both within and beyond the classroom.

As we turn our our ears towards the Gospel of St Luke this year, we consider how we can implement the values of dignity, community and reconciliation into our relationships with each other. Luke gives us deep insight into the plight of those on the margins. We take inspiration from St Luke in his focus on those who society ignores or undervalues. This year we ask ourselves " how can we be the hands and feet of Christ to those on the margins?"

With this in mind, students were introduced to a number of opportunities and experiences that await them over the coming year including work with Caritas, St Vincent De Paul, The Delany Foundation and involvement in Social Justice Forums. We encourage our students to involve themselves in this vast array of faith formation opportunities in 2019.




